Freedom OF Air.

Freedom: 1. The right ~~the~~ to pass over the territory of a country without landing

- ★ ex:- Japan airlines flight from Japan to United Kingdom flying over Russia but not landing there.

Freedom No: 2.

Is the right to land in the territory of a country of non-commercial purpose such as Refueling and without boarding and Deplaning passengers.

Example: Philippine airlines flying to St. Frances Co and land in Guam.

Freedom No: 3.

The right to set down passengers, mails & cargo taken up in the territory of the country. In the aircraft registered

this means that the airlines from one country may land in a different country and deplan passenger coming from the own country.

Example: Quantas flights from Australia to Singapore

Freedom No: 4

The right to take on passengers to make mail & cargo for of country in which the aircraft is registered. that is airlines from one country may land in a different country and board passengers. Travelling to airlines own country

Example: Air India carry passengers from London to Delhi

Freedom No: 5.

It is the right to take on passengers the mail & cargo distinct for another country and the right to set down

passengers mail & cargo in the territory of another country. that means the right to get on plane in a foreign country and get off in another foreign country.

Example: Singapore airlines has the freedom right to freedom to carry traffic Singapore & Los Angeles with the stop in Korea.

Freedom No: 6.

The right to provide transport services b/w which mean to country countries other than the country in which the aircraft is registered but across the territory of your own country. This means the right to carry traffic from one country to another country through your own country.

Example: air India to taking from London to Delhi via Hong Kong why a Delhi

Freedom No. 7.

The right to operate completely outside your country the territory of your own country. do set down passengers and take down passenger mail & cargo. that is the right to carry traffic from one country to another without going through your own home country.

Example 1- Air India flying from London to New York.

Freedom No. 8.

It is also known as cabotage and nearly no country permit it. Cabotage is the carriage of air traffic that originates and terminate within the boundaries of a given country by an airlines of different country.

Example: British Airways doing Delhi
Bombay.

Air India doing New York to
Washington.
