- 1. Attempt six questions (in about 200 words each) selecting at least one question from each unit.
 - (a) Comment upon the relationship between Omar Khayyam and his mother in Shame.
 - (b) Analyze the position of wives and daughters in the novel *Shame* by Rushdie.
 - (c) Describe the role of Prakash in giving a new identity to Jyoti in Jasmine.
 - (d) Why does Jasmine feel stifled while staying with Devinder Vadhera in America.
 - (e) In Jasmine, Jyoti's reaction to the prophecy of the astrologer serves a foreshadowing device. Discuss.
 - (f) Sum up the effects of the 'City Beautification Scheme' on the lives of the roofless poor in A Fine Balance.
 - (g) In A Fine Balance, what role did Shirin aunty and Darab uncle play in the widowed Life of Dina.
 - (h) Write a brief note on the role of Rashid-el-Obeid in Manhattan Music.

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(i) Describe Sandhya and Stephen's visit to Ellis Island in *Manhattan Music*.

Question Nos. 2 to 9 are essay type questions. Students are required to attempt any *four* selecting at least from three units.

Unit-I

- 2. Analyze Shame by Salman Rushdie as a political allegory.
- 3. Draw a character sketch of Iskander Harappa.

Unit-II

- 4. Analyse the various transformations of the protagonist in the novel Jasmine from a diasporic point of view. Does that novelist redefine the concept of diaspora through this process of change?
- 5. How will you interpret the structural device adopted by Bharti Mukherjee by paralleling 'the two parts of Jasmine's life-in India and in the US'?

Unit-III

- 6. In A Fine Balance, Rohinton Mistry "creates an enduring paronama of the human spirit in an inhuman state." Elaborate.
- 7. Set against the backdrop of emergency in India in 1975, the novel A Fine Balance strikes a perfect balance between the narrative structure and various thematic concerns of the novel. Analyse.

Unit-IV

- 8. The major theme in diasporic fiction is to explore the dynamics of home and homelessness. Analyse *Manhattan Music* as a diasporic novel in the light of the above statement.
- 9. Write a note on the narrative style of Meena Alexander on the basis of your reading of the novel *Manhattan Music*.
