## PAPER 1 (THEORY)

- (iii) Define *carrying capacity*. State *any two* factors that determine the carrying capacity of an ecosystem. [2]
- (iv) Give *any two* scarce resources which are diverted to make luxury goods. [2]
- (v) List *any two* benefits of local market to the villagers. [2]
- (vi) Distinguish *traditional agriculture* from *modern agriculture*. [2]
- (vii) List *any two* ecological impacts of the Transnational Companies. [2]
- (viii) Mention *any two* chemical indicators of soil quality. [2]
- (ix) Give *two* objectives of Basel Convention. [2]
- (x) Give the full forms of: [2]
  - (a) IPR
  - (b) GNP

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## PART II (50 Marks)

- (b) Discuss *four* indicators of water quality and *give one* significance of each of them. [4]

#### Question 4

- (a) What are the different techniques of monitoring air quality of a place? Discuss briefly *any two* of the methods. [6]
- (b) 'Women empowerment can bring about a major change in human population'. Discuss. [4]

- (a) What are the pull and push factors of urbanization? Explain *any four* negative impacts of urbanization. [6]
- (b) Discuss urban development planning and traffic management methods used in Curitiba. [4]

#### Question 6

- (a) Discuss the different types of irrigation systems. Explain *any four* advantages and *any four* disadvantages of each type. [6]
- (b) What is a *dry toilet*? How does it work? [4]

**Question 7**

- (a) Discuss the problems related to food security in the third world countries. Give *any two* solutions to tackle these problems. [6]
- (b) Mention *any eight* main features of the Food Security Law 2013. [4]

- (a) What is meant by *defensive expenditure*? Explain its purpose and importance. [6]
- (b) What is *ozone layer*? How does it get depleted? State *any two* steps taken to control ozone layer depletion. [4]

- (a) Differentiate between *free trade* and *protectionism*. State *any two* advantages and *any two* disadvantages of each. [6]
- (b) State the *two* types of externalities. Give *two* examples of each type. [4]

- (a) What is meant by *Cost Benefit Analysis*? Mention *any three* advantages and *two* disadvantages of Cost Benefit Analysis. [6]
- (b) Discuss the case study of aquaculture in India to understand the impact of free trade. [4]
